- All Federal, State and Local firearms laws will be observed. FFL holders may take possession of any firearm on day of sale when they present a signed copy of their Federal Firearms License. New Hampshire residents over the age of 21 may take possession of any firearm on day of sale providing the proper paperwork is filled out and the transfer has been approved either through the NH State Police or the FBI NICS System. While most NICS and State approvals are immediate, approvals could take up to 3 days. Most non-residents may take possession of long guns on day of sale after completing the proper forms and successfully completing a NICS check; modern handguns will need to be shipped to an FFL holder in the buyer's home state. Buyer is responsible for any and all shipping charges and all items must be paid for on day of sale. Bidders should be familiar with their local and state laws.

Firearms are marked as follows:

ANTIQUE - no paperwork required

C&R - for firearms that fall under the ATF Curio & Relics licensing and if purchased by a person with a "C&R License" no paperwork is required. **NOTE:** Items that meet the age requirements but have been altered from their original configuration may NOT be delivered on a C&R License.

Firearms that are not marked with one of these notations are considered to be "MODERN" and all proper paperwork is required unless you are an FFL Dealer.



**2000. SMITH & WESSON SECOND MODEL LADYSMITH HAND EJECTOR REVOLVER**


serial #12595, 22 Long, 3 1/2" barrel with a frosted bore. The metal surfaces have toned to brown with strong traces of original blue in the protected areas along with dings, oxidation blemishes and pitting. The hammer has rich case-hardened colors with light operational wear and the trigger has worn to brown / pewter on the face with strong colors left on the sides. The diamond checkered hard rubber grips with S&W logos rate about very good with light dents, dings and scuffs, mostly on the left panel. The gun still times and locks up correctly and all appropriate parts including the grips have correct matching numbers. (86520-3047) (350/550)

**2001. SMITH & WESSON MODEL 60 CHIEFS SPECIAL REVOLVER** serial #R199039, 38

Special, 1 7/8" pinned barrel with an excellent bore. The stainless steel surfaces rate very good to excellent with scattered light scratches and other handling marks in addition to a turn ring on the cylinder. The service hammer and trigger retain full hard chrome finish. The replacement Sile finger groove checkered rubber combat grips rate near excellent with light handling marks. The gun still times and locks up correctly and should make a great concealed carry or home defense gun. (88450-22) {MODERN} (350/550)

**2002. SMITH & WESSON MODEL 12-3 MILITARY & POLICE AIRWEIGHT REVOLVER** serial #4D06545, 38 Special, 4" pinned barrel with an excellent bore. The metal surfaces of this late 1970's-made revolver retain about 99% factory anodized and blue finishes with a faint turn ring on the cylinder. The checkered walnut factory grips with silver S&W medallions are numbered to the gun and rate excellent. This lovely condition gun includes the original factory box that is correctly end labeled and numbered to the gun, cleaning kit and paperwork. This gun appears to have seen little if any use. (88483-8) {MODERN} (350/550)**2003. CUSTOM INTERARMS MARK X BOLT ACTION RIFLE** serial #8817, .22 Hornet Ackley Improved, 19 1/2" barrel with a bright about excellent bore. The metal surfaces retain about 90% original thinning blue and there are several impact marks next to the caliber designation, most likely from when it was updated. The checkered walnut pistolgrip stock rates excellent with only a couple small blemishes in the finish and it has a rounded cheekpiece on the left side. The magazine floorplate has been professionally replaced with a wooden filler piece and the spring and follower have been replaced with a piece of wood to make this a single shot rifle. This beautiful Mauser-actioned rifle is not equipped with sights, but it has a two piece scope mount on the receiver and the stock is equipped with sling swivel studs and wears a Pachmayr Old English solid rubber recoil pad which provides a length of pull of 14 1/2". The barrel is marked as "K Hornet" caliber. As with any arm, a competent gunsmith should verify the caliber and check headspace before firing. (218476-24) {MODERN} (300/500)**2004. The metal surfaces retain 99% original finish on the golden Brasslite receiver, brass buttplate, and blue barrel and action which show a couple of light handling marks and the buttplate exhibits a little tarnish. The American walnut stock and forearm rate excellent with the right side of the buttstock inscribed with "Let's Roll". This custom inscribed rifle is from a set of rifles purchased as gifts for employees and is as new with its original box. (128087-219) {MODERN} [Kenneth Fry Collection] (350/550)**2005. RUGER OLD MODEL BLACKHAWK REVOLVER** serial #30-00334, 357 Magnum, 6 1/2" barrel with an excellent bore. This 1969-made revolver retains about 97% factory blue and anodized finishes with light high edge wear, scattered scratches and turn ring on the cylinder. The replacement checkered walnut oversized finger groove Herrett's Model RR grips rate excellent. The revolver features factory serrated ramp front sight and black blade adjustable rear sight. The transfer bar safety update has not been performed to this gun. A good solid revolver for range or field use. (88425-6) {MODERN} (350/550)**2006. WALTHER P99 SEMI-AUTO PISTOL** serial #460217, 40 S&W, 4" barrel with an excellent bore. The metal surfaces retain about 99% original black finish and the black polymer frame rates excellent. The pistol features windage adjustable three dot sights, top of the slide mounted de-cocker and ambidextrous paddle style magazine release. serial #CTA255US, .40 S&W, 3 1/4" barrel with a bright excellent bore. The metal surfaces retain 95% of their original Tenifer finish with a few light scratches visible. The third generation sub-compact polymer frame rates ex-

cellent and the pistol comes with fixed white outline sights, a single 9 round factory magazine and hi-rise Kydex style holster. (108500-1) {MODERN} (350/550)

**2008. RUGER SECURITY-SIX REVOLVER** serial #153-34094, 6" barrel with a bright excellent bore. The stainless surfaces rate about excellent showing minor light handling marks with a faint turn ring visible along the cylinder. The revolver has a standard ramp front sight and adjustable rear sight with diamond checkered grips that have silver phoenix medallions in overall excellent condition. Included is a red and black factory box correctly end-label but not numbered to the gun, and with owner's manual. This late 70's production revolver would make a fine addition to any collection. (108483-12) {MODERN} (350/550)**2009. LERUITTE-SMEETS / BELGIAN DOUBLE ACTION BELTMASTER REVOLVER** 10.8mm, 4 3/16" part round part octagon barrel with a lightly frosted bore. This gun has a "[crown] / LS" mark identified to Leruitte-Smeets of Liege and Belgian crown proofs. The metal surfaces retain about 96% reapplied blue that is thinning to purple with light handling marks, oxidized pitting and edge wear plus a few old pits and handling marks are visible under the later finish. Portions of the hammer, trigger and ejector assembly retain strong Nitre blue with light to moderate operational wear. The diamond checkered walnut factory grips rate very good to excellent with light handling marks, mostly on the right panel. This gun is equipped with a safety on the left side of the frame, a lanyard loop and remains fully functional. (88519-2) {C&R} (300/500)

2010. **COLT 1851 NAVY PERCUSSION REVOLVER BY PIETTA** serial #555929, .36 cal., 7 1/2" octagon barrel with an excellent bore. The metal surfaces retain about 99% original blue with bold case-hardened colors still present on the frame, hammer and loading lever. The brass frame rates excellent. The smooth one-piece walnut factory grips rate excellent. This gun appears to have seen little if any use. (88517-6) {ANTIQUE} (150/250)

2011. **HIGH STANDARD DURA-MATIC SEMI-AUTO PISTOL** serial #499473, 22 LR, 6 1/2" barrel with an excellent bore. This Series M-101 pistol retains about 97% original blue with high edge wear, pinprick pitting and scratches. The diamond checkered one-piece wraparound factory grips rate about very good with scuffing on the edge of the left butt and other light handling marks. The pistol features a serrated Partridge front sight and drift adjustable rear sight. This pistol is very good condition but lacks a magazine. (88435-7) {MODERN} (150/250)

2012. **SMITH & WESSON 2ND MODEL SINGLE ACTION TOP-BREAK REVOLVER** serial #29645, 38 S&W, 4" barrel with a very lightly and partially oxidized bore exhibiting a few pits. The

metal surfaces retain about 95% original nickel plate with scattered light flaking and oxidation stains in addition to scratches, bubbling and pitting. The hammer and trigger have bold case-hardened colors with light operational wear and strong blue on the barrel latch. The diamond checkered hard rubber factory grips rate good to very good

with a few minor dings and light diamond point wear. The grips and all appropriate parts are correctly numbered to the gun, barrel-to-frame fit is tight and the gun still times and locks up correctly. An excellent condition second model. 2013. **SMITH & WESSON MILITARY & POLICE HAND EJECTOR REVOLVER** serial #S986253, 38 Special, 5" tapered barrel with an excellent bore. One of the last "S" prefix M&P's to be made in 1948 this gun retains about 98% original blue with light edge wear and a turn ring on the cylinder. The service trigger and hammer retain rich case-hardened colors. The square butt diamond checkered walnut factory Magna grips are numbered to the gun and rate very good to excellent with a small ding on the left panel and a few scattered compressed diamond points. Both diamonds around the escutcheons have tiny chips of wood miss-

ing but they appear to be manufacturing defects. A very nice postwar five-screw pre-model 10 revolver that has only seen minimal use in the last 69 years. (88517-1) {C&R} (350/550)

2014. **SMITH & WESSON MODEL 38 BODYGUARD AIRWEIGHT REVOLVER** serial #34J800, 38 Special, 1 7/8" pinned barrel with an excellent bore. The metal surfaces retain about 95% original blue and anodized finishes with high edge holster wear, a few oxidation stains, turn ring on the cylinder and scratches. The service trigger and hammer retain bold case-hardened colors. The factory grips have been replaced with Crimson Trace checkered synthetic "Laser Grips" that are fully functional and rate excellent. The gun has spent some time in a holster but still times and locks up correctly. The short round butt grips and protected hammer make this a natural for concealed carry. (88523-2) {MODERN} (350/550)

2015. **SMITH & WESSON M&P 40 COMPACT SEMI-AUTO PISTOL** serial #DVE1363, .40 S&W, 4" barrel with an excellent bore. The metal surfaces retain 98% of their black Melonite finish with the polymer frame rating near excellent showing very light holster wear along its sides. The pistol has fiber optic front and rear sights and comes with (4) ten round factory magazines, correct factory hard case numbered to the gun. According to a letter found in the case this pistol was sent back to the factory for some rework and has had some parts replaced. (108498-2) {MODERN} (350/550)

2016. **SMITH & WESSON M&P 9 SEMI-AUTO PISTOL** serial #HRK3882, 9mm, 4 1/4" barrel with an excellent bore. The metal surfaces retain about 99% factory black finish. The polymer frame rates excellent. This pistol features a molded-in rail on the dust cover, magazine safety, ambidextrous slide stop and three dot sights with cocking shelf. The pistol includes a pair of ten-round magazines. (88541-1S20842) {MODERN} (350/550)

2017. **RUGER SP-101 REVOLVER** serial #577-06706, 22 LR, 4 1/8" barrel with an excellent bore. The stainless steel surfaces rate about excellent with a very light turn ring on the cylinder. The rubber factory grips with diamond checkered walnut inserts and laser etched Ruger logo rate excellent. This revolver features a barrel with ejector rod shroud, square blade front sight with fiber optic insert and black blade fully adjustable factory rear sight. This SP-101 will be great on the trail, as a trainer or for small game hunting. (88544-23D29806) (350/550)

2018. **COLT MODEL 1877 LIGHTNING REVOLVER** serial #89731, 38 Long Colt, 3 1/2" barrel with scattered light pitting. This 1893-made revolver without ejector retains about 90% original and reapplied blue. The grip frame has original blue with the backstrap worn to brown, frontstrap thinning to purple and blue, scratches and edge wear. The frame and barrel have reapplied blue finish that has faded with edge wear, scratches, oxidation blemishes and minor pitting. The un-numbered checkered hard rubber factory grips rate about excellent with light handling wear. The grip studs on the frame are cut off, the loading gate spring is weak and the gun still functions mechanically. (88433-37) {ANTIQUE} [Paul Weisberg Collection] (350/550)

**2019. FRANCHI MODEL 48AL SEMI-AUTO SHOTGUN** serial #A83380, 12 ga., 26"

Poly Choked barrel with a bright excellent bore. The metal surfaces retain 98% original blue and anodized finishes having some scattered spots of light fine oxidation staining with some very light silvering on the high edges of the receiver. The receiver is importer marked and the Poly choke is missing its bead. The checkered pistolgrip walnut buttstock and finger groove forend rate about excellent with a few light handling marks and spots of flaking varnish. A versatile bird gun that is adaptable to most hunting environments with a flick of the wrist. (108339-24) {MODERN} (350/550)

- 2020. COLT WOODSMAN TARGET SEMI-AUTO PISTOL** serial #39823-S, 22 LR, 6" barrel with an excellent bore. The metal surfaces of this second series 1949-made pistol retain about 85% plus original finish with scattered light oxidation stains, thinning finish on the grip frame, high edge wear and handling marks. The checkered thumb rest synthetic factory grips with Rampant Colt rate very good to excellent with a few light handling marks. The pistol features a serrated ramp front sight and Coltmaster rear sight. The pistol includes a single factory magazine. It should make a great little trail gun or shooter. - 2021. COLT HUNTSMAN SEMI-AUTO PISTOL** serial #001421S, 22 LR, 6 1/4" barrel with an excellent bore. This 1969-made pistol holds strong condition. The metal surfaces retain about 96% original blue with light stains present on the right side of the slide, barrel and receiver in addition to light high edge wear and handling marks. The checkered walnut grips rate about very good with light handling wear and flaking finish. The pistol features a bottom magazine release, serrated ramp front sight and drift adjustable rear sight. The pistol includes a single factory magazine and should make a great plinker or trail gun. (88472-2) {MODERN} (350/550)

- 2022. COLT 1991A1 COMPACT MODEL SEMI-AUTO PISTOL** serial #CP06796, 45 ACP, 3 1/2" barrel with an excellent barrel. The metal surfaces retain about 90% original blue that is starting to thin to gray along with high edge wear, frontstrap mostly worn to pewter, assembly marks and handling wear. The double diamond checkered laminated hardwood factory grips with silver Colt medallions rate excellent. This version of the Officers Model features three dot sights, extended slide stop, beavertail grip safety, extended thumb safety and flat serrated mainspring housing. The gun includes a single magazine. This gun has spent some time in a holster but has many more years of good service left. (88470-8) {MODERN} (350/550)

- 2023. U.S. MODEL 1917 REVOLVER BY SMITH & WESSON** serial #86781, 45 ACP/AR, 5 1/2" barrel with an excellent bore. This August 1918 made revolver has about 50% original blue with moderate to heavy wear and scratches. The service trigger, service hammer and lanyard loop have strong case-hardened colors fading to a gray-pewter mix with the lanyard loop all pewter. The un-numbered smooth walnut factory grips rate good to very good as lightly cleaned with light dents and dings plus the metal is proud of the wood in the corners. The "[ordnance bomb]" on the frame and "[eagle] / S21 or S22" are crisp and the gun still functions mechanically. This gun will make a great shooter or restoration project. - 2024. SMITH & WESSON K-200 BRITISH CONTRACT MILITARY & POLICE HAND EJECTOR REVOLVER** serial #750956, 38 S&W, 5" barrel with an excellent bore. This Australian Department of Defense marked "Victory" revolver retains about 99% arsenal type later applied Parkerized finish with old pits and handling marks visible under the new finish along with some later handling wear. The service hammer and trigger have strong case-hardened colors with moderate operational wear. The smooth walnut factory grips are numbered to another gun and rate about very good as lightly refinished exhibiting light handling wear. This gun has Australian Department of Defense markings, factory-thorough-repair markings dated 1955, Lithgow inspection marks along with the usually inspection and proof marks found on commonwealth guns plus an importer mark. Timing and lock up are good and the lanyard loop is present. A nice revolver for the start-up collector or if you want a good shooter. (88523-28) {C&R} (350/550)

- 2025. COLT OPEN TOP SPUR TRIGGER REVOLVER** serial #46650, 22 RF, 2 3/8" barrel with a good to very good bore showing pitting with good rifling throughout. The barrel and cylinder have toned to pewter with scattered fine staining, a little pinprick pitting and some tiny impact marks. The brass frame has toned to a pleasing ochre patina with areas of tiny impact marks. The hammer and trigger have toned to gray closely matching the barrel with faint traces of fire blue on the protected areas of the trigger. The walnut birdshead grips rate about very good with light handling marks, worn flaking varnish and are both pencil numbered to the gun. The barrel is numbered to the frame, the cylinder advances but the hammer no longer locks back. (58547-46) {ANTIQUE} (350/550)

- 2026. RUGER SECURITY-SIX REVOLVER** Serial #153-11532, .357 Magnum, 6" barrel with a bright excellent bore. The stainless surfaces rate excellent showing a few light scratches, faint turn ring on the cylinder and very minor holster wear. The revolver has a pinned ramp front sight with black blade adjustable rear sight. The diamond checkered walnut grips with phoenix medallions rate excellent and included with this revolver are a correct factory red and black box correctly end-labeled to the gun with shipping sleeve, manual and related papers. - 2027. TAURUS 45-410 JUDGE REVOLVER** serial #BW693939, 45 Colt / .410 bore, 3" barrel with bright excellent bore. The stainless surfaces rate near excellent with a few light handling marks and light turn ring along the cylinder. The hammer, trigger, and thumb latch have a bright gold color plate and the revolver has a square groove rear sight with fiber optic front. The black "Ribber" grips with Taurus logo medallions rate excellent and included is a correct factory box end-labeled and numbered to the gun with manual, keys, tool and warranty card. The metal surfaces retain 98% original blue finish with a few light scratches, spots of minor silvering at the muzzle and a light turn ring along the cylinder. The revolver has standard sights and the diamond checkered Magna grips with silver S&W medallions rate excellent having crisp points, minor handling marks and are numbered to the gun. Included with this revolver is a black leather Buchheimer B7 holster with silver snaps that remains in good overall condition. (108425-4) (350/550)

**2029. WINCHESTER MODEL 94 COMMEMORATIVE CENTENNIAL '66 LEVER ACTION RIFLE** serial #8224, 30-30 Win., 26" octagon barrel with a bright excellent bore. The barrel, lever, hammer, loading gate, trigger and hammer retain 97% original blue with light handling marks and spots of freckling. The frame, forend cap, and crescent buttplate retain 98% bright gold color plate with scattered light scratches and spots of fine oxidation staining. The rear sight has been removed and a blank inserted in the dovetail. A Williams aperture sight has been installed on the frame and the front blade sight remains. The smooth high gloss finish walnut straight grip stock and forend rate good overall with a few light handling marks and a near full length crack on the left side of the forend. This is an honest shooter with a touch of golden flair. Included is a Gun Slinger hard case and a black nylon zippered sleeve. (108541-9S20796) {C&R} (300/550)

**2030. BELGIAN CENTER HAMMER PERCUSSION FOLDING TRIGGER POCKET PISTOL** .67 caliber, 2 3/4" octagon barrel. This pistol is unmarked except for a Belgian proof on the frame and a '(crown) / V' on the barrel. The barrel shows 85% textured twist pattern. The frame is engraved in bold foliate scroll and bears an even gray patina. The walnut bag shaped grip rates very good with about 85% original finish and with clamshell shaped hinged compartment in butt. (18484-24) {ANTIQUE} (350/450)

In the fall of 1863 he was with the XII Corps under Hooker to join Grant in Tenn. and marched with Sherman to the sea. After the war he had a brief run in politics. The bayonet measures 14 1/2" long with a 10" spade shaped blade that is 3 1/2" wide at its base. The blade section is a light mottled gray that is blending with areas of light surface oxidation and fine pitting. The blued socket grip section has some minor pitting over much of its surface. A very good example overall. (1X48366-23) (300/500)

**2472. LOT OF POCKET KNIVES** This lot includes three. First is an unmarked, assisted opening knife measuring 4 1/8" closed with a 3 3/8" pen blade that appears untouched with a few light usage marks. The checkered hard rubber grips rate excellent and there is a small spot of oxidation staining on the blade near the bolster. Second is a thumb assisted NRA commemorative knife by Stone River with belt clip. The hardwood checkered grip panels rate excellent and the edge appears untouched. The metal is bright as the bayonet has been bead blasted over its entire length and the U.S. marking is very light. There are spots of light oxidation and pitting present and the keeper ring is missing. The bayonet is in about good overall condition. (2X107536-83)

**2475. UNMARKED ASIAN BOLO SHORT SWORD** This long bolo measures 30 1/2" overall with a 26" curved bolo style blade. The blade has been cleaned bright with overall horizontal brush marks, remnants of scattered pitting and tiny chips in the worn main edge. There is no maker mark on the sword and the leather buffer washer is no longer present. The hilt has a brass triple branch guard and Phrygian pommel; the grip is covered in black leather with remnants of wire wrapping under the pommel only. The brass has toned to a nice dark patina with light staining and some tiny impact marks, the reverse edge of the guard is marked with a large "X" and the face of the quillon is stamped with a crown over "BV". The leather shows some light wear and scuffing along the edges, the grooves have a thin line of light verdigris where the wire wrapping was once present. 

The leather covering shows scattered light flaking, one of the wire strands is partially broken below the pommel. The steel scabbard has toned to brown with scattered pitting and oxidation. **2480. U.S. MODEL 1917 TRENCH KNIFE BY L.F.C.**

This is a WWI trench knife by L.F. & C. measuring 14" overall with a 9" triangular blade. The hilt has pyramidal studs on the D-shaped guard and retains about 80% original blue toning to brown with scattered fine oxidation. 

The blade is maker marked "GEBR./HART-KOPT/SOLINGEN" and "Warner & Co./Muhlhausen in Thr.", it remains partially bright with scattered oxidation. The crossguard shows oxidation staining throughout and some flaking, while the pommel is a dull brown patina with oxidation staining throughout. The grooved wooden handles have an added varnish, a small crack on obverse side, scattered dings and some handling marks. No scabbard or frog are included. (208514-49B)



**2769. AMERICAN EXPRESS CO.-WELLS FARGO & COMPANY EPHEMERA LOT**

This lot consists of an antique "American Express" hanging sign. The sign, quadruple bordered in red and black ink, reads simply "American" above a federal shield and "Express" along the bottom, both of these in an arc surrounding the shield. It is hard to tell but the original colors may actually have been blue and red, on a white background but with the foxing and ingrained soiling from the years the colors have faded. This label is affixed to a stiff card stock background with brass or tin eyelets riveted through the card stock and label, no doubt to suspend over an American Express window in a railway station or elsewhere. Externally the sign measures about 15" by about 12". There are some areas of loss to the label around its periphery, most prevalent in the area around the suspension holes. The next item is a Wells Fargo & Company receipt dated December 19, 1900. The freight receipt is written to E.D. Parson for something glass, valued at \$25, on its way to A. Waters of Rochester New York. There is a one cent documentary federal tax stamp affixed to it in the upper right corner. It shows a couple of folds from the years but is over all very good to excellent. The rear of the receipt shows numerous advertisements for Wells Fargo & Companies express lines throughout the world. The document measures 8 1/2" by 5 1/2". The last piece is a 1907-dated Wells Fargo & Company "Express Special Rate Circular No. 31". It is for "Special Rates for Oregon". The reader is instructed to "refer to tariff and erase from list of Oregon points named therein: Astoria/Clifton/Clatskanie/Fort Stevens/Rainier/Seaside/Warrenton" these offices having been closed. This shows a bit of ingrained soiling and foxing with a minor moisture stain on along its lower edge. The document measures 8 1/2" by 5 1/2". A neat lot of Wells Fargo/American Express Co. ephemera. **2770. FIREARMS HANGTAG LOT** This lot consists of two antique hang tags and six modern tags. The first item is a very rare Colt Fire-Arms Manufacturing Co. hangtag for a 10 Bore shotgun No. 9880. It had 30" barrels and weighed 9 3/4 Lbs. At 40 yards it would keep 320 and 318 pellets in a 30" circle (left and right barrels respectively). The tag shows some minor foxing and a bit of oil staining along with a few very small tears. The attaching string is intact. The next item is an A.H. Fox hangtag for a Sterlingworth serial #139102. The arm was a 12 gauge with 30" tubes choked mod. And full. This tag is marked with the Savage name and Utica address. It rates very good with a few minor stains and the hanging string is intact. Lastly are three Remington Arms Co. hangtags. Likely from the 60's or 70's. There are three for ".22 Rifles", two for shotguns, these in the shape of a shotshell, and one for "Big Game Rifles". All six rate very good plus to excellent and all have their green attaching string intact. A nice lot overall, we have never encountered and actual Colt Firearms hangtag before. **2771. L.C. SMITH EPHEMERA LOT** This lot consists of a catalog and an envelope, which no doubt held a catalog. The L.C. Smith catalog is from the post 1906-period, as its frontispiece lists the accolades won at the Eastern handicap, Grand American handicap and the Lewis and Clark expositions, in 1902-1906. The cover features a color image of hunter and dog with the company name, the image somewhat sun-faded. 32 pages total, bound by a wound string. The front and rear covers, as well as the pages immediately following and preceding them, have come detached. The interior is very nice and fully readable and covers their full line of arms. The rear of the catalog has a moderate amount of pencil "cyphering" on it, someone having used it to do arithmetic. The front cover shows remnants of old cellophane tape and a water stain in the upper right corner. The next item is an envelope from the Baker Gun, manufactured by L.C. Smith, Syracuse, NY. It shows an image of the gun, and extolls the arm's virtues. The envelope, which no doubt held a catalog, was addressed to Mr. C. Shufey of New Market, Shenandoah Cty. VA. It shows a bit of soiling and a small missing corner piece with a mouse-nibbled piece missing at lower right. There is a cancelled 1 cent stamp affixed. An interesting lot for the L.C. **2772. NEW YORK STATE POWDERHORN** This is an older antique Powderhorn, likely post-flintlock period, with interesting engraving from the period of use. The horn measures about 11" overall and is a cream-colored patina at its base and toning to a translucent yellow-tan mid-body to chocolate brown at the nozzle. There is a semi-bulbous softwood plug fitted retained by 15 hand wrought square iron brads with a button-shaped iron brad at the apex of the dome as hanger provision. The body is reduced its entire length to form a conical nozzle but no stopper is present. The base of the horn shows two dogs chasing a buck along with a pair of initials in panel "F". Above this is an image of a waterway with flat boats navigating, each with a single sail and a man at the tiller atop a flat-roofed cabin. In the background are rolling mountainous hills with trees and settlements, this appearing very much like upstate New York, in the capital region on the Hudson. There is a geometric band above-which is an Eagle atop a globe flanked by a Federal Shield, plow and sheaf of wheat left and harp and fouled anchor right, with some foliate decoration, a crescent moon and star on the back of the horn. The horn certainly has some age and the engraving was done during the period of use. (38433-91) [Paul Weisberg Collection]

**2773. CARVED MODERN POWDERHORN** This is a modern powderhorn with flat softwood plug and neat saw-tooth edging, much of which has chipped away. The body is rather large and is about 16 1/2" overall length. It is a translucent cream color at its base transitioning to a dark gray-black at the nozzle. The body is reduced and culminates in a fancy ribbed medial about two thirds the way down its length with a nonagonal faceted section, two more medials, another nonagonal faceted section then checkered medials and a flaring nozzle. There is a small eyelet affixed at the flat base which is a replacement, there is a more elaborate ring and eyelet affixed near the nozzle as hanger provision. There is rather nice engraving of a Federal Eagle with "E Pluribus Unum" in riband at the base of the horn with 13 stars between his out-stretched wings. Behind this on the back of the horn within a rectangular geometric border is "Arouse Jolly Bacchus of the Horn to Embrace,/Twill Cheer up the Spirits to Follow the Chase,/It Will Brac (sic) up the Nerves the Game to Pursue,/and Cause the Bold Huntsman to Give the Halloo", a legend found on antique powderhorns from the colonial period. As-mentioned the base shows a number of chips around its periphery and a small crack, most of which would disappear were the sawtooth edge trimmed down to be in line with the flat plug. Overall a nicely made modern horn that would be perfect for the reenactor or primitive huntsman. (38433-90) [Paul Weisberg Collection].

**2774. ANTIQUE ARTILLERY PRIMING POWDERHORN** This is a plain-bodied 13 1/2" priming horn with turned concave hardwood plug with detachable turned hardwood filler plug. The horn is a translucent cream color toning to a darker gray at the nozzle end. The nozzle or priming end features a conical nozzle with simple incise grooves. It features a spring-loaded cut off, the very tip of which is no longer present but would be an easy fabrication for anyone mechanical. There are two iron eyelets attached as a hanging provision, perhaps below-decks where the horn would hang for the gun crew. and rather nice antique artillery priming horn over all. (38433-14) [Paul Weisberg Collection]

**2775. ANTIQUE GUNNING BOX WITH SNIPE DECOYS** This is a red-painted box with hinged lid and a single drawer. On the interior are two snipe decoys, amongst an array of old adhered feathers. Each decoy retains some nice old paint, one bird standing, one bird feeding. They are roughly 9" in length with about 2 1/2" beaks. Each decoy has a circular hole in its base for stand, none is included, no doubt the hunter would merely pick a suitable twig from the surrounding area. There is a recessed area for the decoys within the box, they fit rather well. Beneath this there are recesses for 16 shotshells, there are 15 old paper-hulled 12 ga. shells included showing various degrees of tarnish on their bases, they are primarily Peters but also with some Rem-UMC and in SR & Co. Mallard, with various shot sizes present. The pull-outer drawer features an old nickelized 12 ga. priming tool which is slightly oxidized, brass funnel/ram with turned rosewood plunger, a turned rosewood decapping block, a metal hand-made wad press and a rosewood and nickel shot/powdered dipper. The lid is currently detached but four screws would rectify that in short order. Really a rather nice hand-made gunning box overall from some shore-gunner of yesteryear. **2776. GERMAN M17 STAHLHELM LOT** This lot consists of a World War One era German M17 Stahlhelm with a dark green camouflage paint that may be post war applied. The exterior of the helmet shows scattered flaking paint, scratches and oxidation. The interior is an oxidized brown patina with scattered flaking and staining. There are no visible size or maker's markings on the interior and there is no liner assembly present. The steel sweatband is loose and it is an overall oxidized brown patina with a large section missing and there is a broken original leather chinstrap present with scattered dirt staining, crazing, crackling and flaking. **2777. ITALIAN NATIONAL PARTY CAP** This lot consists of a black Italian fascist national party cap. The exterior of the cap shows some scattered dust and dirt staining. The interior has a maker's mark and it shows some scattered small staining spots. The sweatband has a prominent tear on the right side, there are a few other smaller tears in the liner and a prominent tear on the right side of the interior. A very good example of a fascist Italian cap. (208409-19F)

**2778. ITALIAN M33 HELMET** This lot consists of an Italian M33 helmet. The exterior of the helmet has a textured green paint with scattered light flaking spots. The interior has a smooth green paint with "BT78" stamped on the left side of the skirt, some scattered flaking and oxidation. The liner shows scattered crazing, dust staining and staining from the years. A very good item for the military collector. (208409-16C)

**2779. NAZI MOTORCYCLE HELMET** This lot consists of a World War Two Nazi leather motorcycle helmet. The front of the helmet has a Nazi eagle over swastika plate with scattered light oxidation. 

**2783. MUSSOLINI LOT** This lot consists of a framed drawing and a bust of Italian dictator Benito Mussolini. The drawing shows a young Mussolini in 1922 sitting and reading a document. The drawing was done by an unknown artist, the picture measures 8" in length and 6 1/2" in width, the frame measures 14" in length and 11" in width. The bust is marked "BENITO MUSSOLINI" on its stand, it appears to be bronze and it shows scattered oxidation and flaking throughout. The bust measures 6 1/4" in height and 4 1/2" in width at the shoulders. An interesting lot for the student of history. (208409-20B)

**2784. ITALIAN PITH HELMET** This lot consists of an Italian military tan pith helmet. The front of the helmet has a cloth black eagle over a trumpet and cannons. The light tan helmet shows some scattered dark and white stain spots. The interior of the helmet has the same tan paint with scattered light staining and the rear interior of the dome is marked "56". A great item for the collector of Italian militaria. (208409-19E)

**2785. ORDNANCE LOT** This lot consists of 20 rounds of Italian 7.35 ammunition, a Breda machine gun clip and an inert 45mm Brixia mortar round. The ammunition shows scattered tarnish and they are housed in the Breda clip which also shows scattered tarnish. The mortar round shows scattered oxidation with the heaviest oxidation being at top. **2786. NAMED USAF P4A HELMET LOT** This lot consists of a named US Air Force P4A flying helmet. **2787. GERMAN M38 PARATROOPER HELMET** This lot consists of a German M38 style Fallschirmjäger helmet. The exterior of the helmet has a gray feldgrau paint with scattered light flaking, scratches, scuffs and some small spots of oxidation. The interior has the same gray feldgrau paint with scattered flaking and light oxidation. The rear of the interior is marked "7191" and the left side is marked "ET71". The liner and chinstrap are likely reproduction and show scattered crazing and dirt staining. There are no decals on the helmet and it has the spanner type rivets. **2790. ITALIAN MILITARIA LOT** This lot consists of four pieces of Italian fascist militaria. The first two items are fascist brass shoulder boards present that show scattered light oxidation.
